**Seven Fallen Feathers (2017)** (<https://www.ttalaga.ca/seven-fallen-feathers>) Over the span of eleven years, seven Indigenous high school students died in Thunder Bay, Ontario. They were hundreds of kilometres away from their families, forced to leave home because there was no adequate high school on their reserves. Read the stories by award winning author Tanya Talaga.

**The Right to be Cold**, Sheila Watt Cloutier. One woman's story of protecting her culture, the arctic and the whole planet (2016)

**Dances with Dependency**, Calvin Helin (2008) Recommended by our very own Father Ed Hinsperger

**From the Ashes**, Jesse Thistle, (2019) In this inspiring debut memoir, Jesse Thistle, once a high school dropout and now a rising Indigenous scholar, chronicles his life on the streets and how he overcame trauma and addiction to discover the truth about who he is.

**Richard Wagamese:** Richard has many wonderful books worth reading. A well-known Indigenous writer in Canada, Wagamese won several awards including the Canada Council for the Arts Molson Prize (2013) and the Writers' Trust of Canada's Matt Cohen Award (2015). His works speak about the historical and contemporary socio-economic issues affecting Indigenous communities in Canada. They also bring attention to issues regarding Indigenous identity, culture and truth and reconciliation. A beloved writer, Wagamese's works have inspired many Indigenous and non-Indigenous peoples and writers alike.
