Dear sisters and brothers in Christ, We celebrate Easter, the high point of our liturgical year. As Spring breaks in around us, we marvel at the almost magical appearance of new life pushing up through the ground and out of the branches in the trees. The birds sing as they build nests and prepare to lay eggs and welcome

new life! Throughout the season of Lent we were horrified by the shocking death and destruction of the war in Ukraine. The remarkable courage of the Ukrainian leader, the brave soldiers, and the committed citizens have given us heart and hope that they might actually succeed in saving their homeland. The Delegation of Indigenous First Nations, Inuit, and Metis representatives to The Vatican met with Pope Francis also lifted our hearts and gave us fresh hope that a new relationship is possible. The possibility of a Papal visit to the Indigenous peoples at Lac Ste. Anne, Alberta, provides us more opportunity for such hope. We celebrate our greatest hope at Easter – the Resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead. The Resurrection is for us an eternal wellspring of hope. No matter how dark, how desperate, how impossible a situation we find ourselves in – if we look to the Lord who has conquered even death, there is always reason for hope. I pray for you sisters and brothers in Christ, for you our Parish Priests, in gratitude for your faithful, creative, and generous service especially during these past two difficult years; for the Parish Secretaries, Pastoral Workers, and volunteers who make our Parishes places of hope and joy; and for all those who long for our prayers – that they too may experience the healing love of the Lord. Happy Easter, my friends. Pray for Pope Francis – he always asks us to do so. And pray for me!

"Father Stu"



The course of Stuart "Stu" Long's life veered radically after a near-death experience and spiritual conversion led him to the seminary. It changed again when he was diagnosed with a degenerative disease that would lead to his death at age 50. "Father Stu", a new film starring Mark Wahlberg and based on the true story of this extraordinary priest, was released in theaters on April 13. It is one of the most theologically interesting films to come out in a long time. It considers some of the thorniest and most puzzling themes in the sacred science, including the nature of vocation, the purpose of suffering in the divine plan, the role of supernatural agency, the dynamics of redemption, and perhaps most thoroughly, the mystery of God's providence. Easter Season

He is Risen! From the empty tomb on that first day of the week, the women brought good news to the Apostles. It was the Good News of: ...hope. ...forgiveness. ...peace. ...eternal life. This is such Good News that Catholics celebrate Easter not just on a single day, but all year long, in different ways. We celebrate the Resurrection every Sunday, the "little Easter" of our week. We also celebrate it for the seven weeks of the Easter season, which is considered one single feast day, called the "Great Sunday." The Easter season lasts fifty days, beginning on Easter Sunday and ending on Pentecost Sunday. We celebrate Ascension part way through - forty days after Easter. Because the date for Easter changes every year, the dates for the other feasts do as well. The joy of the Easter season is reflected in our words: Two "Alleluias" are added to the dismissal at Mass: we hear The Mass is ended, go in peace, Alleluia, Alleluia, and we respond, Thanks be to God, Alleluia, Alleluia! "Alleluia" is also added to the ends of prayers and antiphons in the Liturgy of the Hours. In Eastern European cultures, it is typical to greet others with "Christ is risen," to which the response is, "He is risen indeed!" The light

and life Christ brings into the world are reflected in the symbols of: The Paschal Candle, which is lit during the Easter Vigil and during all liturgies of the Easter season. After that, it is kept next to the baptismal font and lit at baptisms. It is also used at funerals. The liturgical color of white, symbolizing the purity of our life in Christ and his glory. Easter lilies, which represent the beauty and glory of Christ.
