Perhaps we love stories because they give us insight into ourselves, revealing to us a deeper sense of meaning in our lives. The Bible is the story of God's love for you and me. It begins with him creating us out of love, redeeming us by that love, and finally transforming us in his love. This divine author is love—an eternal exchange of love within the life of the Blessed Trinity: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. What a story!

From the Pastor's Desk

Page 182 to 185 of the weekday, *Living with Christ* Missalette has a great article entitled *Holy Labours: Cleaning.* In this article, its author Simone Brosig compare a 'life changing' method for decluttering and managing our possessions called the KonMari Method (which focuses not on what to get rid of but "what to keep"), with the Lenten season and the instructions given in the General Instruction to the Roman Missal (GIRM- the how-to instructions for communal worship and our liturgical space). The reality and simplicity of Lent is beautifully echoed in both. We are called to look at what we have, and indeed to focus on what is essential, what brings us the deepest sense of joy, and I might add, peace. This process involves the need to clear space in our lives to see beyond, to respond to the Lenten invitation to "Repent, and believe in the Good News", which quite literally means in Greek to have a 'mind' which is able to see 'beyond', *meta-noia*. Have a read of the article!

My reason for referencing this article is to touch upon the character of the liturgical space as you may have experienced it here at St. Clement's as we've entered into Lent. You may have noticed a very simple Altar cloth now adorns the Altar, no flowers or other greenery adorns the sanctuary, the Ambo itself has been moved slightly inward to bring it a greater prominence, the baptismal font no longer has the Paschal candle standing beside it... simple and yet somehow noticeable simplification. You might even have noticed that our music has taken on a different, simpler character, with the use of the simple chant for the Mass parts and the lessening of preludes and postludes as bookends to our liturgies.

This process of simplification is an important part of the Lenten season, in accordance with the GIRM, and helps us to focus in on what the church asks us to consider, the journey, temptations and simplicity of the Lord in the desert, and that of the Israelites, the self-gift that we see in Christ's journey and death on the Cross, in which he gave everything, his very life to draw us into that new life He has made possible. This Lenten journey and the character of our liturgical space may even lead us to consider the need we have in our own lives to do the same. As the article says, to honour and celebrate what is essential, and to let go of what no longer is as necessary, not as something bad, but as something that helped us to get where we are. We do this so that in an ever greater way we can give of our whole lives like Christ and more fully embrace the gift of new life from God's redeeming gift of His Son.

Yes, things will return, flowers and greenery, Altar cloths with lace and decoration, music and the organ blaring in praise (!), many things will return at Easter and throughout the year. But I hope you will join me in celebrating the noble simplicity and beauty of the church, indeed, we are so blessed here at SC in that way. To allow our hearts to open to a new place of living, that our minds, hearts, souls, might see beyond, and that we might in an ever greater way appreciate the journey we have been on, the journey that will always lead to the glory, beauty and fullness that is Easter.

I pray you are all having an amazing Lenten journey. Much more happening, do stay tuned!
