# From the Pastor's Desk

What is it they say, from the sublime to the ridiculous? Well, it is not sublime or ridiculous most of the time, but from week to week a pastor's life can certainly swing from the deeply spiritual to the eminently practical. And such is the week that has been as I have returned from my road trip and visiting with my brother priest in Florida.

First, the deeply spiritual. I may have mentioned to some of you that from 2018 through 2021, I completed a course of studies in Spiritual Direction Ministry with the Institute of Priestly Formation at Mundelein Seminary in Chicago. These studies helped to prepare me for the multitude of requests for spiritual direction. I have a number of directees whom I see from month to month or sometimes just occasionally. Through IPF we learned a style of spiritual direction which is known as 'contemplative listening', which is more about allowing the HS to be felt and heard in the course of direction sessions, and less about giving directives or exercises to a directee. I have had a few appointments for direction this past week, always a very blessed opportunity to see and feel the HS's working in the midst of individual lives and our life as a community, especially as we round out Lent and prepare for Holy Week.

Well, from the deeply spiritual to then the eminently practical....

This week I have confirmed the appointment of our Finance Council. Our first meeting was held a few weeks back with a general overview of how finance councils work, a general overview of our finances, and my hopes for how they might help and guide me and our parish in the years to come. After accepting confirmation of their willingness to serve our parish as a member of the council this past week, I will be sending letters to confirm their appointments, a three year term, renewable once, this coming week. Thanks to those who said yes, more details and reports to come following our next meeting.

These past months (and this past week) I have also been meeting with our Architect and others involved in the *Gathering Space* project and the *One Heart One Soul* Campaign. I am excited to share that we should be ready to take next steps through the Easter Season. It will be on the agenda for our next finance council to review the 'Strategic Plan' as it has been developed by the Architect. This plan addresses and commits not only to the *Gathering Space* project, so vital for our life as a community, but also looks at meeting room, office, and rectory spaces so that we might be well prepared for the next 100 years of parish life at SC. After discussions with the finance council at our next meeting, we will also invite some conversations with the OHOS committee, our parishioners (!), the Diocese, and Bishop. There are many steps for a project of this type, but it is very exciting all the same. All of these steps are done in the hopes of building up not only approval at all levels but also excitement that things are coming together. Once we receive the approval, feedback, and guidance at all levels my hope is to be able to say what we are doing, when we are doing it, and concrete next steps to get it done!

Finally, I would ask your prayers for the priests of the diocese as the clergy appointments were released this past Friday. I was elected by my brother priests last fall to sit on the committee which discusses and discerns these moves. It is never an easy thing, for priests or parishes, as we are all well familiar with, but a time nevertheless to give ourselves (all of us) to Christ and the service to His Church with our whole selves. Oh, and FYI, no, my name is not on the list! We have too much good going, and indeed such hope ahead, I want to be part of it all!

Well, pray for me, and do be assured of my own prayers for you. We enter into the most sublime, deeply spiritual and in some ways eminently practical time as a Church this week. Holy Week is a time not only to feel spiritually those realities of our salvation, but also to practically walk with the Lord, into Jerusalem this Palm Sunday, through the events of Holy Thursday and Good Friday, and to sit in the silence, hope and assurance that is Easter glory. What a journey we follow, what a journey ahead! - Fr Markus
