From the Pastor's Desk

The Lord is Risen, Alleluia Alleluia!

The stone was rolled back, the tomb was empty, He is not dead, He has risen! Someone recently passed on a little chuckle I'd like to share with you: When Joseph of Arimathea offered his newly hewn tomb for the burial of Jesus, one of his friends commended to him saying 'what a generous man you are Joseph, to give your new tomb for Jesus burial', Joseph, having met Jesus, heard his words, simply remarked, 'oh it's no big deal, He's only using it for a few days!' Lol. True!

We know we all look forward to that day of the Resurrection, that day when our own tombs, our graves will be empty, that day when we will be called into the very physical life of the Resurrection. Well, that is the day we await, but we are waiting. I'm stuck to reflect on this waiting in light of some work I've been doing in recent weeks, all surrounding tombs, graves, engravings. First, my own father's grave. As some of you may know he died many years ago (37 years ago) and is buried not far from here. Being close by, I decided it was time that I called up the cemetery, the local memorial company to have his gravestone repaired. Over the years, the flowerpot that is supposed to be removable, has become seized into the bronze marker itself. This marker names not only my father but also my mother (still with us in this world) and the simple inscription 'Loving parents of Nicholas, Jeffery, and Bradley'. I'm told the repair will be done, no problem, one more thing taken care of.

I've also been working of having a gravestone prepared for my father's mother, my Oma, she died in 2019, but with the long few years that have been, we have yet to make these arrangements. All is underway. I even discovered a little family history, full names for my Oma, Aunt and others, along the way, who knew. The name by which they will be called on that day of the Resurrection! Amazing.

Finally, that brings me to enquiries I've been making regarding the cornerstone of our church which is out on the front left corner of the building. The history books simply say that the stone was never engraved, which is usually done with the date of its blessing, or the date of dedication, including the bishop who did so, or other details. The memorial stone company has come by and thinks we may still be able to add an inscription! What a beautiful project this would be as we set out on the next 100 years of life in Christ as a Parish. I am working on finding some details regarding the history, let me know if you have any thoughts or would like to lend a hand with these arrangements.

Finally, our cemetery here at St. Clement's. I've had some conversations with the 'Catholic Cemeteries of the Diocese of Hamilton' to understand our role in caring for the cemetery, it's upkeep and use. Unfortunately, as many of you know the cemetery is 'full' or at least the graves currently laid out are all sold. I've had on my heart the desire to see what we can do to expand, or offer additional burial plots, or at the very least columbariums for cremated remains. From a very initial conversation, it seems there may be some possibilities. Stay tuned, and if you're at all interested in helping with this project, do let me know. I think it would be an incredible gift to the parish, perhaps to you reading this, to have the possibility to offer more space in that place where so many SC faithful await the Resurrection.

Well, as you can see, graves, engraving, honouring the gift of life, faith, death, and the hope of resurrection and new life, are the name of the game this Easter. I hope and pray what I share piques your interest. We have a legacy, indeed, a legacy and life which point us to consider not just what is past, but what is next! Stay tuned! Fr Markus
