# From the Pastor's Desk

What's old is new, what's new is old! How the history books turn, and indeed, perhaps some have lived long enough to see this adage prove true. My own mother was telling me how track suits and the colours of the 80's are coming back, she knew there was a reason she kept all those old fluorescent favourites for the past 40 years!

I was sent an article from the diocesan archives this week that was written somewhere in the late 1920's or early 30's. It tells some of the story of St. Clement's and the Preston area. In the article it speaks of the variety of persons living in Preston, "freethinkers and atheists, the Lutherans...the Catholics next in order of importance", and that was in 1947! Later in the article it says: ..."looking closely at the history of the Preston mission it is safe to say that, at times, it was sadly neglected, chiefly on account of the scarcity of priests." And here you are with little old me, and sadly the need continues to be great, "Pray to the Lord of the Harvest, that He may send labourers into his harvest"! Finally, and I don't mean this as any insult, the article speaks about how "the people are quite ignorant as to their faith". We all have so much to learn, and such a gift in the treasury of our Church's life, let us delve the riches together!

I have asked Franki to insert this article in the bulletin this weekend, I hope you enjoy it as much as I did. There are other sources of history I have come across for St. Clement's, perhaps that would be a good summer series, just to print excerpts from the archives?

History being what it is, loved and forgotten, I was asked this week about what my vision is for St. Clement's going forward, not just looking back. I have been listening and praying deeply the past months with you for this clarity. I think it is becoming clearer, and before the summer break, I hope to share with you a few words about where I feel, and where many have shared with me, the Lord is drawing us...how's that for a teaser!

Finally, I am reminded of an old saying, 'history doesn't repeat itself, but it does rhyme'. Let us pray that rhyme of the Lord's good work here in Preston, in each of your lives will continue to be heard and known, and indeed that an encounter with the Risen Lord will be experienced by all!
